WHAT IS THE YOUNG LEADERS OF THE AMERICAS INITIATIVE (YLAI) FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM?

The Young Leaders of the Americas Initiative (YLAI) is the U.S. Department of State's flagship program for emerging entrepreneurs and leaders from the Western Hemisphere who are seeking to drive economic and social progress in their communities and region.

THE YLAI PROGRAM HAS THREE CORE COMPONENTS:

- a customized educational entrepreneurial leadership curriculum,
- cultural exchange and networking activities, including a Closing Forum in Washington, D.C.,
- and a professional placement with a U.S.-based organization.





After hosting Akola in Albuquerque, New Mexico, Pamelya traveled to Georgetown, Guyana on an Outbound Exchange program. They met with grassroots organizations working towards ending gender-based violence, and convened a discussion group about labor laws to address the importance of women understanding their rights in the workplace. During this discussion, Pamelya highlighted nontraditional skilled trade as as a catalyst to lead women to sustainable professions. Pamelya and Akola will continue to combat gender-based violence by developing ways for women in Guyana to enter nontraditional skilled trade.
